Noteworthy Claims Handled:

- » Universal Health Services: \$264,000,000 settlement. Devastating damage caused by Hurricane Katrina to three separate hospital campuses in New Orleans. The claim included building, emergency services, improvements and betterments, bio-medical equipment, medical supplies, IT and telephone equipment, facility management and office equipment, accounts receivable, valuable papers, claim expenses, and business interruption.
- » Auburndale Properties: \$8,450,000 gross settlement. A highly disputed Hurricane Katrina building and loss of rents claim at three shopping malls. The end result was four hundred percent greater than the insurance carrier's offer prior to Mr. Landow's involvement
- » Columbia Recycling: \$13,000,000 net settlement. A catastrophic fire at a carpet recycling plant in Georgia, which involved building, machinery and equipment, stock and business interruption.
- » Wellington Regional Medical Center: \$11,400,000 gross settlement. A Hurricane Frances loss at an acute care hospital facility in Florida. The claim included building, bio-medical equipment, emergency services and extra expenses, and business interruption.
